Because colleges/universities that request a counselor recommendation place great importance on this, we ask that you do the very best you can in completing this profile. The better job you do on the profile, the better we can do with the recommendation. If you prefer to complete the profile using a computer, please indicate to which question/statement you are referring. Last but not least, be sure to make a copy of this profile (as you should with all completed applications) to keep with your records. You may find it helpful as you work on your applications. Good luck, and we look forward to working with you!

Describe at least one significant event in your life and why this event had an impact on you.
Use three or four adjectives to describe yourself. Why do these adjectives best describe you?

What are your special strengths as a person? Please be specific.
What do you feel you have contributed to the MCHS community?
List any job(s) you have held in the last three years, and the responsibilities assigned to you.
Please discuss anything you would particularly like included in your recommendation.
Please list your extended essay/senior exit topic. Why have you decided on this topic?

Parent Insights

One of the most important responsibilities of the college counselors is the writing of the Secondary School Reports, or the letters of recommendation, for seniors. These reports will show each student in as full and as favorable a light as possible. To aid us in constructing these reports, please take the time to respond to this form. We know your child in the context of the school, but your insights from "the home front" can really lend substance and life to any description of your student's personality and character.

On a separate sheet of paper please write us a letter about your child. Please remember that we already have your child's transcript and that he/she is providing us with a resume' of activities, so you need not dwell on these factors. Please paint a clear picture of your son or daughter. In particular, please note any examples of leadership, commitment, talent, etc. that we may not be privy to. Also, where appropriate, please note any special circumstances that may have affected your child's performance in high school.

Again, we cannot emphasize how valuable your comments can be to us. Specific examples, incidents, or anecdotes are particularly helpful. Perhaps the following questions will help you write the letter.

- *Describe one incident which illustrates the quality in your child which gives you the most pride.
- *Choose two or three adjectives to describe your child and give one specific anecdote to support each adjective.
- *Describe personal interests which may not be otherwise reported, i.e., avid interest in reading outside of school, athletic abilities, community activities.
- *Assess your child's strengths and weaknesses.

Are there any special considerations which will affect the decision where to apply (costs, distance from home, personal situations etc.)?

Are there any colleges that you see as particularly suitable for your child?
